Our Special Masterclasses are similar to our monthly sessions but are open to all cohorts and sometimes Alumni. This year's special Masterclass was with **Nikhil Rathi**, the CEO of the UK's Financial Conduct Authority.



Skills Sessions

Our partners and supporters, such as the Hogan Lovells, KPMG and Flint Global, and our Alumni lead these sessions. Some of the sessions we had this year were:

- On average, participants rated these sessions an 8/10, and 88% would recommend them to others.


Average Programme rating out of 5:






Confidence getting a job in politics:

Masterclass Mentoring Scheme

Every year, we offer our current Patchworkers, as well as our Alumni, the opportunity to have a mentor in a field that they are interested in. This year, we had 61 mentoring pairs complete the scheme.

Mentees received guidance on various different aspects of their career prospects, including:

- · Development of soft skills
- · Building confidence
- Career support within different departments (e.g. civil service)
- CV guidance, interview preparations, and aid in writing job applications
- Importance of taking care of your mental health
- Bettering communication skills

Hogan Lovells Mentoring Programme

Alongside our mentoring programme for the 2022 Masterclass cohort, we launched an additional mentoring scheme with Hogan Lovells for Patchworkers specifically interested in law or change-making.

Hogan Lovells sponsored five Patchworkers to complete the scheme, and each matched them with two members of their team.

To kick things off, we had a launch event with the programme participants as well as members of Hogan Lovells. It was an evening filled with speeches, networking, and introductions.





Party Conference Programme

Our annual #GetInvolved Party Conference Programme went ahead again, returning to in-person sessions with the Conservative and Labour parties. Unfortunately, we were unable to attend the Liberal Democrat's conference this year, but we look forward to attending in 2023!

We had 62 applications and offered 26 young people a place.








Impact:

Politics to Save the Planet

We had the opportunity to partner with the **US embassy** and **Algbra** to host an event for the first time at the **Natural History Museum**, which focused on how Politics can save the Planet. Our event took part in the week-long programme at the museum, with a focus on tackling climate change globally. Overview

Our 2022 awards saw 49 MPs nominated, with 108 individual nominations.

The public submits all nominations, and our independent judging panel then use anonymised research to decide the winners.

Our 2022 Awards Ceremony were kindly hosted at Speaker's House, Westminster Palace, on Wednesday, 14th December 2022.

We had over 160 attendees this year, including our current Patchworkers, winning MPs and senior individuals across different sectors.

The evening celebrated the work of different MPs. It gave our Patchworkers from the 2022 cohort the opportunity to reflect on their own experiences on the programme and provide a real insight into the work that Patchwork does.





International Visitor Leadership Programme

In 2022, we ran the International Visitor Leadership Program (IVLP) in collaboration with the US Embassy again. A group of Patchwork Alumni, chosen for their leadership and commitment to helping minority communities, spent three weeks meeting leaders and representatives across the US to learn more about American culture and politics.

Due to COVID, our 2020 participants were unable to travel to the US. So, this year we had a 'make-up' year where we sent out participants from the 2020 programme as well as the new 2022 participants. In sum, 16 Patchwork Alumni flew to the US to immerse themselves in the programme's activities.








Impact:

In December, we were joined by some of our Alumni for our annual end of year dinner, where we caught up with one another on the events of the year.










Summer Diversity Internship Scheme

We launched our Summer Internship Programme in partnership with CCHQ. This was a paid internship opportunity which ran for six weeks.

We received a total of 301 completed applications. The programme ran for six weeks, with 12 young people accepted for the internship.

The internship saw participants complete three two-week rotations across different departments of CCHQ. Each Friday, interns completed 'Patchwork Development Days' covering topics such as public speaking, leadership, personal branding and networking.
